

Funding for the Tobacco Dependence Program at UMDNJ-School of Public Health and outside funding for individual faculty and staff members (for the 3 years to July 2008) Dated August 5, 2008.

The Tobacco Dependence Program has been and continues to be largely funded by competitive grants from **New Jersey State's Comprehensive Tobacco Control Program, part of the New Jersey's Department of Health and Senior Services.** Jonathan Foulds is the Principal Investigator (PI) on those grants.
